Behind the Worship: Rituals and Relevance

Doxology

There are certain parts of our worship service that are so familiar, so ingrained we could do them in our sleep. I'd have to check with Bri but I'm pretty sure I have. But just because something's familiar doesn't mean it's unimportant.

Take the moment right after the offering. After the congregation has walked the aisle and brought their offerings forward, we stand, and we sing:

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow; Praise God, all creatures here below; Praise God, blest Holy Trinity, Both now and for eternity. Amen.


We do this every week. Chances are if you have visited other churches, even from other denominations, you will have sung this with them as well. Though, perhaps, with slightly different words (and definitely with different tempos. Some churches can sing this in under 10 seconds flat).

The words trace back to Thomas Ken, an Anglican priest in the late 1600s. He wrote them as the closing stanza of morning and evening hymns for the students at Winchester College in England. He wanted to help the young folks remember to praise God throughout the day. (If you've ever tried to get teenagers to do anything twice a day, you know the poor priest was herding cats.)

After that stanza, what we now call "the Doxology", was first published in 1709, it found its way into just about every Protestant hymnal under the sun.

Why do we sing it after the offering though you might ask? Because it makes sense. The offering is more than a mid-service moment to stretch our legs. It's a moment when we respond to God's generosity with our own. We're not just giving money to keep the lights on, we're giving thanks. We're supporting ministry. Expressing hope for the future. And we're reminding ourselves that everything we have is a gift.

Singing the Doxology at that moment lifts the whole act into something sacred. It transforms a practical task into a liturgical proclamation: "We see what God has done, and we're grateful."





At Trinity we sing a version with different wording than the one you might've learned growing up. Ours avoids gendered pronouns for God while it lifts up the fullness of the Trinity. Why? Because how we speak about God matters. Words shape theology. And at Trinity, we strive to reflect a God who is bigger, broader, and more inclusive than any single human image can contain.

Our version still praises the one from whom blessings flow. It still lifts the voices of all creation. And it still calls us into reverence and gratitude. But it does so in a way that's true to who we are as a community that welcomes all and believes God's love has no boundaries.

The Doxology is one of those "little things" that carries big meaning. It reminds us every week: That we're not in this alone. That God is good, even when life isn't. That giving and gratitude go hand in hand.

So the next time you stand to sing it, don't let the muscle memory take over. Let the words sink in. Let the gratitude rise up. Let the song be your prayer. Even if the act of standing and singing feels automatic, the praise doesn't have to be.

Ministry Spotlight

All Things FoRT: Holy Moments of Listening, Sharing, Learning, and Serving

"FoRT" is short for "Friends of Rohr at Trinity." We are folks who enjoy gathering weekly for fellowship and discussion of books written by Father Richard Rohr.

Richard Rohr is a Franciscan priest who founded the Center for Action and Contemplation in 1987 in Albuquerque, NM. The mission of CAC is to introduce Christian contemplative wisdom and practices that support transformation and inspire loving action in the world. His work points us to our intrinsic oneness with God and with each other.

Some of us have followed Rohr and the CAC for years while others of us are unfamiliar with anything Rohr. Wherever we start, together we desire to integrate action and contemplation in our lives.

We currently have two FoRT groups meeting weekly. DBC (grow Deeper, love Better, see God more Clearly) meets on Sundays, 5:00-6:30 pm, in the Fireside Room and on Thursday our EvB (Everything Belongs) meets in the Library from 6:15-7:30pm. There are 19 who regularly attend our DBC group and 23 attend our Everything Belongs group, with several attending both groups each week and 6 joining us from the community. We have a total of 37 persons involved in the FoRT ministry - a long way from the 3 who first gathered in the Fireside Room in November, 2017.

Our weekly FoRT groups study different Rohr books but our model for each gathering is similar. We welcome you to join us! For more information, please contact Merrita Tumonong (616-240-4538) or talk with one of the group members from Trinity (see below).
