Behind the Worship: Rituals and Relevance

Happy Mid-Year!

Back at the founding of the United States, Thomas Jefferson suggested that the Constitution should be rewritten every 20 years or so.

He wasn't worried about any particular part of the document. No, he was concerned that any system, no matter how good or well intentioned, can become a relic if we don't revisit it. If we don't ask the hard questions, the future ends up being held hostage by the past.

Now, Jefferson didn't get his way, obviously. But the idea sticks with me, especially in July, when flags are flying and fireworks are booming and we're all a little more aware of the stories that built our country.

I can't help but think the same idea applies to the church.

Not just our church. The Church. Somewhere along the way, we got stuck. We've been tinkering with the same blueprint for decades, sometimes centuries, and now we're shocked when it doesn't quite work for the world we're living in.

Rev. Dr. Jasmine Smothers spoke at our recent Michigan Annual Conference. She pointed out our tendency to let the past block the future. She talked about her approach to church that she calls "the blank slate", a chance to start fresh. Not by throwing everything out, but by asking better questions. Like:

What if we designed a church for our neighborhoods now?
What would it look like?
What would it smell like? (Hopefully not musty hymnals.)
What would you not bring back?
What would be so vital, so Jesus-shaped, you couldn't leave it out?

Rev. Smothers reminded us that people are walking past our buildings every day assuming they're closed, both literally and spiritually. And if we want to be more than just a relic, more than just a Sunday-only crowd that loves the way things used to be, we've got to pick up the pencil.



We've got to ask who's missing.

We've got to remember our why.

We've got to be brave enough to try new things, knowing some of them will flop.

We've got to lean into the Spirit, not nostalgia.

This summer is a good time to ask those questions. We're halfway through the year. The pace is a little slower. And if Jefferson was right, maybe the middle of the calendar is a good place to re-evaluate what we've been building.

So here's your mid-year invitation:

Grab a pencil. Ask the questions. Dream big. Let's sketch the kind of church that our community needs and more accurately reflects the people we are becoming.

105: the number of hot dogs & brats eaten Saturday night; total number of marshmallows - unknown.


70 plus: the number in worship at camp on Sunday morning.


Countless: the memories made!!

Aman Park at 0-1859 Lake Michigan Dr, Grand Rapids, MI 49534.

There is a drive on the right (north) side of Lake Michigan Drive after you pass through Standale, but before you get to GVSU or Allendale. Once you turn onto the Aman Park / Indian Trails Camp drive, you'll continue a little way until you get to several small gravel lots on the left side and a larger lot on the right. Park in either and then meet at the north end of the drive near the large gate.

Friday, August 15 from 1:00pm-2:00pm

Ken-O-Sha Park at 1353 Van Auken St SE, 49508.

The park is on the grounds of Ken-O-Sha Elementary School. Park in the northwest corner of the school lot near the nature playscape. You can get to this lot by taking either Kenosha Drive SE or Van Auken Street SE west from Kalamazoo Ave SE.

Both these summer friendly parks offer lots of shade, but you'll probably want to pack/wear bug spray!

Contemplative Walk - Wednesday, June 25 at 7:00pm


