

# A Little Help from Our Friends – Journeying Through Lent Together

Lent is the 40-day journey leading up to Easter, a time when Christians prepare their hearts by focusing on repentance, sacrifice, and renewal. For many this is a deeply personal season, a time of deep reflection, fervent prayer, and critical self-examination. Many who observe Lent take on new spiritual practices or let go of habits that distract them, in an effort to draw closer to God. But if we make Lent only about personal faith, we miss something essential: that we are not meant to walk this road alone.

This year, as we explore Lent with the Beatles, we're reminded that faith, like life, thrives in community. The song, With a Little Help from My Friends, captures a deep truth about the Christian journey: we need each other. Jesus didn't call his disciples to a solitary faith. He called them into a movement. He sent them out in pairs. He gathered them around tables, in boats, and on the road, teaching them that the love of God is not something we hoard, but something we share.



As we enter this season of Lent, we are also in the midst of difficult and uncertain times in our world. Many are struggling with fear, division, and the weight of injustice. It's easy to feel isolated, discouraged, or even powerless to bring about change. But here's the good news: being together in community is the first step on the road to transformation. We may not be able to fix everything, but we can show up for one another. We can be the kind of people who listen, who encourage, who stand up for what is right.

And one of the most powerful ways we show up for one another is by journeying through Lent together, and not just on Sundays, but through the full experience of the season. The road to resurrection winds through the ashes of repentance, the breaking of bread and betrayal, and the dark weight of the cross before it ever reaches the empty tomb. We cannot fully celebrate Easter without walking through the depths and darkness of Holy Week together.

That's why I want to encourage you to be present for our special services and gatherings we share as a faith community:

**Ash Wednesday** (March 5, 7:00 PM at Trinity, joint service with St. Paul's UMC) – The journey begins in ashes as we confront our mortality and need for grace.

**Hosanna to Hallelujah** (Tuesday, April 15, 5:30–7:30 PM at Trinity) – A hands-on Holy Week experience for all ages helping us walk through the final days of Jesus 'life.

**Maundy Thursday** (April 17, 7:00 PM at Trinity, joint service with St. Paul's UMC) – We gather at the table, remembering Jesus' last meal and his commandment to love one another.

**Good Friday** (April 18, 7:00 PM at St. Paul's UMC) – We stand at the foot of the cross, remembering Christ's sacrifice and the depth of his love.

Lent reminds us that resurrection is coming, but we don't get there without the journey. And the journey is easier when we walk it side by side. This season, I encourage you to lean into our faith community. Worship together. Pray together. Engage in meaningful conversations. Encourage one another to do good. And when the road gets hard, remember that we are stronger together. With a little help from our friends and a whole lot of grace from God, we will stay strong in mind and spirit.
